

SALES INTEGRITY TASK FORCE TO HOLD PUBLIC FORUM

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LEXINGTON, Ky. - The Sales Integrity Task Force will hold a public forum on Monday, October 15, 2007 at 1 p.m. in the Keeneland Sales Pavilion to present its preliminary recommendations on ownership and medication disclosures at public auctions, as well as licensing of agents. The forum will include a presentation by several participants on the task force as well as a period to take questions from the audience.

"The task force has been diligent in its efforts to address a number of important and specific issues and we believe that the recommendations are thorough and sound," said Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the NTRA and moderator of the Sales Integrity Task Force. "We also believe that it is important to reach out to the equine community to consider their comments on the task force's recommendations before anything is finalized."
