TOBA TO HOLD PEDIGREE AND CONFORMATION CLINIC IN LEXINGTON, KY.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (TOBA) will hold a Thoroughbred Pedigree and Conformation Clinic Monday, October 8 and Tuesday, October 9 in Lexington, Ky. The clinic, sponsored by Blood-Horse Publications, will feature conformation presentations and live evaluations as well as pedigree discussions that will include nicking, dosage, outcrossing and inbreeding. Clinic speakers will include Rob Keck, Susan Martin, Meg Levy, Dermot Ryan, Adrian Wallace, Headley Bell, Dr. John Park, Matt Lyons, Kirt Cahill and Dr. Chris Cahill, DVM.
